The statewide Scholastic Art Awards have been announced and Perpich continues its tradition of placing widely and well in the competition. The total number of Perpich golds in visual and media arts is 16; total number of silvers, 21; total number of honorable mentions, 28. Two visual arts portfolios won silver and two media portfolios won honorable mention.

The state-level Scholastic Art competition and exhibition takes place at Perpich this year. On Saturday, Jan. 11, judges from around the state came to Perpich to rank submitted artwork from students throughout Minnesota. Those pieces chosen, including those of Perpich students, will be in exhibition in Perpich's visual arts gallery Feb. 5-23. Visitors are welcome to come view the exhibition any time during Perpich Center's business hours, 8 a.m.-4:30 p.m.

The Scholastic Art & Writing Awards attract more than 90,000 teens in grades seven through 12 from around the nation who annually submit more than 185,000 works of art and writing in 28 categories. Winning students earn opportunities for recognition, national exhibition, publication and scholarships.

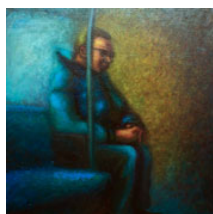

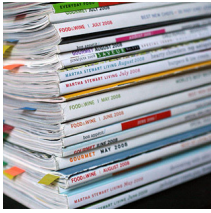
Art history instructor present for Martin Luther King Day

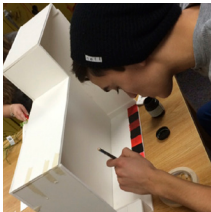

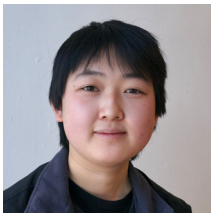


Perpich band debuting its CD, show includes another Perpich act
