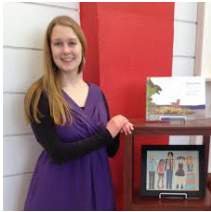

Perpich student publishes book for teens who have a parent with cancer

Katie Jecha, a senior in visual arts, has published a book, "Reflections . . . Teen Thoughts on Having a Parent with Cancer." It is currently on display in the first-floor atrium and made its debut at the 2014 Angel Foundation Gala. The Angel Foundation is an organization providing support groups and camps for children and teens who have a parent with cancer. To create the book, Katie collected comments from teens in the program as well as other quotations she felt were appropriate and then used using cut paper technique to illustrate the quotes.

Katie became involved in the Angel Foundation because her father, Steve, has been treated for cancer. She is also a Girl Scout and the book served as part of her Gold Award project (the Girl Scout equivalent of Boy Scouts' Eagle Scout achievement). To fund the book's creation and printing, Katie ran a [Kickstarter campaign](#) that raised over \$3,400, allowing her to donate 200 copies of the book to teens involved in the Angel Foundation's programs.

She also was "artist in residence" for four weekly classes teaching teens at the Angel Foundation the techniques of cut paper art, that will culminate in a large group project for display at Angel Foundation headquarters.

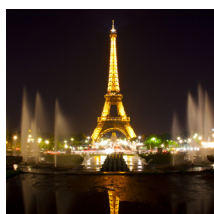


Visual arts instructor wins award

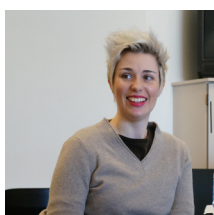

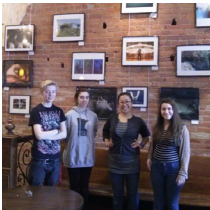


Spanish and modern world history classes merge for field trip

Students from Elaine Drivas' Spanish classes and João Bichinho's modern world history class took a field trip to the Regla De Oro Gallery in Minneapolis at the end of February to see "I Will Die the Way I Lived" an exhibit of 15 paintings by Antonio Guerrero,. Guerrero is one of the Cuban Five, Cubans who were monitoring what they considered to be terrorist activities of anti-Cuban exiles in Miami. They were arrested by the FBI in 1998, tried in what a federal appeals panel called "a perfect storm" of prejudice, convicted and given sentences ranging from 15 years to two life terms.

Artsience student makes presentation to Arduino Group

Naomi Green, junior in artsience, made a presentation about her project to the Arduino Group Thursday evening. Arduino Group is an organization of hardware and maker enthusiasts with a focus on Arduino, an open-source electronics prototyping platform based on flexible, easy-to-use hardware and software. Artsience student competed in China

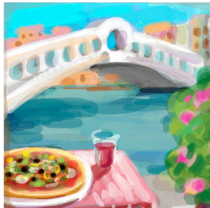

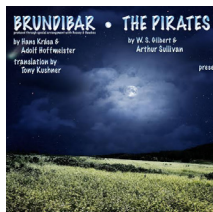
