New school director appointed at Perpich

Antwan Harris, who joined Perpich Dec. 3, 2012 as assistant principal, has been named Perpich Arts High School director, effective immediately. He succeeds Carlondrea Hines, who, after being named principal of both Perpich and Crosswinds Arts and Science School in Woodbury last summer, will focus solely on the Crosswinds program.

Harris came to Perpich from ISD 191—Burnsville, Eagan, Savage—where he served as dean of students for four years. Previously, he taught in the Osseo and then Robbinsdale school districts for about 10 years before taking an administrative role in the Burnsville district. He also worked as an administrator handling discipline procedures and as a district cultural diversity coordinator.

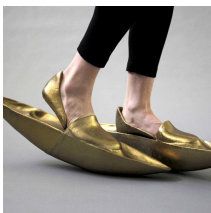
He holds B.S. and M.A. degrees in kinesiology from the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities and an educational leadership certificate from St. Cloud State University. His licenses and certifications are in K-12 physical education and K-12 administration with pending licenses for superintendent and special education director.

In addition to his work in schools, Harris is recognized as “one of the most successful youth coaches in Minnesota at age 40,” according to “The Minnesota Daily.” He started coaching an Amateur Athletic Union (AAU) team in 1995 and led the team to its first ever title in ESPN’s AAU national championship. This success earned him the honor of coaching for “various medal-winning youth teams for USA Basketball in 2007 and 2009-12” six times, according to “The Daily.” This year, Harris was “promoted to head coach for the Nike Global Challenge in 2013, when he led his team to a bronze medal,” according to the University of Minnesota newspaper.

Ta-coumba Aiken, a big advocate for Perpich, is a painter and public art maker in the Twin Cities. His work will be featured in the Laboratory Fine Arts Gallery in December and he will be speaking to visual arts students next month. Perpich workshop for dance educators focused on “The Language of Dance”

As part of Perpich’s arts courses for educators, Diane Aldis, dance education coordinator for the professional development and outreach team at Perpich, led an all-day workshop Nov. 8 based on the “elements of dance” vocabulary and concepts and “Brain Dance,” which uses the eight movement patterns that humans develop during their first two years of life. The day was constructed of opportunities for teachers to learn through doing and apply Perpich dance lessons and tools to their K-5 classrooms and grades 6-12 content areas. Twenty-eight metro and outstate educators from seven different school districts attended the workshop.

These teams started in August with the kickoff of what is a two-year professional development program. Teams attend workshops at Perpich and receive additional coaching and planning services as well as site visits by teaching artist instructors. The schools also receive a grant to cover expenses such as substitute teachers and travel costs.

New Perpich Scholarship established in Aaron Hilden's name

Linda Henning, president of the Perpich Foundation, announced the establishment of a foundation scholarship program in the name and memory of Aaron Hilden, music teacher at Perpich and Crosswinds, who died unexpectedly at the end of October from complications of diabetes.

"We deeply mourn his passing and our hearts go out to his family," Henning said. Funds raised for the scholarship will be given to Perpich music students who excel academically and artistically and are accepted at a four-year college, university or conservatory to pursue a degree in music, music education or other related program. The first scholarship will be awarded to a graduating arts high senior in the spring of 2014.

The foundation made an initial contribution of \$250 to the scholarship fund. Crowd-sourcing invades the halls of Perpich

Installations have popped up around the building asking for viewer participation. Visual arts seniors are currently working on crowd-sourced art projects. They studied the work of contemporary artist, such as Aaron Koblin and Phil Hansen who draw on James Surowiecki's "wisdom of crowds" concept to make art with the contributions of thousands of people.

Students were given an assignment to create their own crowd-sourced art projects. They could decide what scope of participation was reasonable for them. Some chose to engage only other visual art students; others are seeking contributions from the Perpich community; and others have turned to social media to engage a global audience. These are works in progress and may continue to grow as the year goes on. Over the summer we will exhibit the more successful projects in the Laboratory Fine Arts Gallery. Visual art juniors will be given this same assignment in the spring.



2D visual arts class gets a “curve ball”

Pat Benincasa’s 2D Fundamentals students were given an unusual challenge for their final project. They were asked to cut out 30-40 magazine images of objects, using art elements of line, color, shape, texture and value to guide their selection. They could not use faces, hands, feet or text. They then organized painting compositions using at least eight of their images out of context. The paintings are non-narrative, do not tell stories and are not organized by theme. Students had to organize their objects based on the overall design flow of art elements and use objects free from their real life functions. This project is called “Viewfinder Mixed Realities” because students are approaching painting through a different view and juxtaposing multiple realities, scales and value systems in one painting. The results are on the walls in the west studio.
