Perpich Center now managing Crosswinds Arts & Science School in Woodbury

Crosswinds Arts & Science School opened for the 2013-14 school year Sept. 3 under a management agreement with the Perpich Center. Crosswinds will maintain its current curricular focus in the arts and science, its IB program, year-round schedule and strong commitment to integration. It is now an open-enrollment school, meaning parents and students from any Minnesota district may choose to enroll there. Perpich intends to seek and receive formal legislative approval this fall to govern the school beyond the current school year.



Perpich professional development arts coordinator celebrates book publication

Barbara Hackett Cox, arts coordinator for Perpich's professional development and outreach, is the co- author of the just-published "Teaching Artist Handbook," along with Nick Jaffe and Becca Barniskis. New faces at Perpich this fall

Visual arts has two new teachers and Bill Jeter, long-time visual arts faculty member, has moved into a part-time role as a teacher this year.

Pat Benincasa is a new full-time visual arts teacher. She was adjunct faculty in the foundations department at the College of Visual Arts for six years until its closing in June. She also is on the faculty of St. Mary's University of Minnesota Graduate School of Business & Technology where she is teaching advertising design this fall. In her current work about Rust Belt Cities, Benincasa paints with industrial materials on sheet metal. She recently received an Award of Excellence from the American Juried Art Salon and was one of four artists selected for an artist residency and exhibit at the Toronto School of Art. She has a MFA and MA from Wayne State University in Detroit and K-12 licensure from St. Catherine University, St. Paul.

Wesley Wallace who began teaching at Perpich in 2001, has returned from a three-year sabbatical in London and is teaching biology and physics. While on sabbatical he earned a master's degree in sustainable development at Middlesex University.

Sandra Woodhall is a new part-time teacher in visual arts who will provide classes in watercolor, illustration-drawing, advanced drawing, ceramics, jewelry and animation. She taught in the Wayzata and Anoka school districts before coming to Perpich. Woodhull has a BA in studio arts from St. Cloud State University and an MA in art education from the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities. In 2011 she received a grant from the Minnesota Education Association, "Celebrating Our Similarities and Differences in Our Life and Learning Styles," with artist-in-residence Ta-Coumba Aiken.

Aki Shibata is a new part-time teacher in media arts. She taught high school media arts and visual arts at FAIR downtown and book arts at the Minnesota Center for Book Arts. She received a BFA in photography from the College of Visual Arts. While she was in the undergraduate program, she had formal training for teaching as an artist by Lynda Monick Isemberg. She is currently enrolled at St. Mary University to complete her MA in instruction.

Jessica Leibfried has joined the professional development staff as a music education coordinator. Leibfried earned a BM in music education from St. Olaf College and an MA in music education with a concentration in Orff-Schulwerk pedagogy from the University of St. Thomas. She specializes in elementary music education and has taught in Hong Kong, Japan and several districts in the state of Minnesota.

Lynn Clafin is the new cafeteria manager and chef at the high school. He is part of the new team of Treat America that is now managing the food program for Perpich.



Literary arts teacher John Colburn has new book of poetry coming out in October

John Colburn's new book of poetry, "Psychedelic Norway," published by Coffee House Press, arrives in bookstores Oct. 13. The publisher describes the book as a: "site of play and a place for the rupture of expectations. Sentence, folktale, confession, pop quiz—all allow for the chaotic impulse behind the imagination, defying the tyranny of orthodoxies with a visionary Midwestern populism that argues for enchantment as the moral imperative of our time."

As part of the promotion of this book and another that was recently published, "Invisible Daughter," Colburn has been doing readings around the Twin Cities including one at Magers & Quinn Booksellers in June, and Soap Factory and Common Good Books in August. He will be reading from his work at Maeve's Café, 300 13th Ave. NE, Minneapolis, at 7 p.m., Oct. 3.
