A. Meet the key players

Georges Bizet (1838-1875)

- French composer of the opera *Carmen*
- Main characters of the opera are Don José (a naïve soldier), Escamillo (a famous bullfighter), and Carmen (a gypsy)
- The opera premiered in Paris in 1875 and created a scandal because of its working-class characters, sense of social chaos, and an on-stage death
- Bizet’s work wasn’t appreciated during this lifetime, but *Carmen* is now thought of as one of the greatest operas of all time

Maria Callas (1923-1977)

- She was born in New York City to parents who had immigrated from Greece
- Maria was pushed into singing lessons at the age of 5 and moved to Greece with her mother at 13 to continue her studies
- Her professional debut as an opera singer came in 1941; she performed in many of the great opera halls across Europe, often returning to La Scala in Milan, Italy
- Remembered as one of the most celebrated opera singers of the 20th century for her vocal technique, wide vocal range, and dramatic interpretations

Bobby McFerrin (born 1950)

“Bobby McFerrin is a restless seeker who knows no bounds... He has continually redefined not only his own music but the very role of the artist. In a world where others push product, Bobby McFerrin promotes experience. His concerts are not about supporting his latest release, but about the release of creative energy. This is go-with-the-flow music, created on the spot, never to be repeated. McFerrin’s palette is every style of music he’s ever heard, a genuine cross-cultural cross-breed. It’s jazz, pop, R&B, classical and world music—or, more accurately, out-of-this-world music—all rolled into one, sometimes within the same song.” – bobbymcferrin.com

Aziza Mustafa Zadeh (born 1969)

- Born in Azerbaijan, Aziza is a singer, pianist, and composer
- Aziza made her singing debut at the age of 3 improvising vocals with her father
- She studied piano beginning at a young age, and two of her favorite composers were J.S. Bach and Frédéric Chopin
- She uses elements of jazz, classical and the avant-garde in her music, along with mugam—a traditional improvisational style of Azerbaijan
